



**Character Quilt-** For this activity, you will first cut out all the shapes. Then, you will write the answer to each question on the back of each shape. Make sure you stay within the shape. Once you are done answering the questions, you will organize the shapes into a figure. You will create an image using the shapes, and the image must relate to the myth you were given. You will glue your image onto another piece of paper. You will present what you have done to the class with your group. Make sure that every student participates. When you are explaining make sure to have evidence to support what you are saying. You need a good explanation for what you wrote down.

Questions for Character Quilt

1. What is the theme of the myth?
2. What did the myth explain. For example, the creation of \_\_\_\_?
3. Write a quotation showing a relationship with nature.
4. Explain how this myth might have impacted the tribe or why it would be meaningful.
5. Character traits of one of the characters in the myth.
6. What is the tone of the myth?
7. What is a motivation for one of the characters in the myth?
8. Is there a resolution in the myth, and if so, what is it?

Character Quilt

For the character quilt you will need to present one of the shapes in front of the class. Here is a rubric to help you get the most points possible.

1. Maintain Eye Contact\_\_\_\_5pts\_\_\_\_
